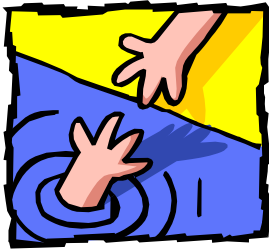

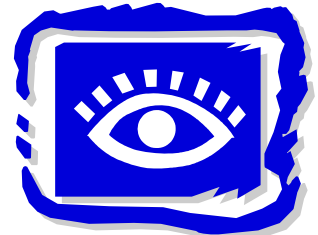


OUR MISSION:

Reaching out to homeless children to provide a steady and friendly future for street children who have no other form of support. This is achieved through comprehensive programmes which include shelter, nutrition, skill training, medical aid, recreation and counselling and education.

OUR VISION:

Creating an environment for all round development of young homeless children, making them aware of themselves with relation to the world and their problems, thus mobilising their potential to work collectively for a better future for themselves and a cleaner, healthier and peaceful planet.



OUR APPROACH:

SKCV follows the "**C H I L D**" SYSTEM OF STRENGTHENING

(**C H I L D** = **C**omprehensive **H**elp to **I**ndia's **L**ittle **D**estitutes). The system consists of five phases, which are briefly:

- 1** Meeting street children on the streets, in parks or on railway stations.
- 2** Night Rescue Centres in City Centres (providing medical aid, nutritional support, education and counselling)
- 3** Non-formal and Formal Education Facilities (providing opportunity to children for academic education)
- 4** Vocational Training Schemes / Workshops (providing skill training in specific trades and Cottage industries)
- 5** Older Working-Child Rescue Centres (providing medical aid, nutritional support, education and counselling)

The system is a process that every child goes through, when he/she enrolls himself/herself on his/her own accord into the strengthening process and concurrently the system is quite flexible depending on the child's interest.

Through SKCV Street Child Rescue Projects, multitudes of deprived youngsters are gaining a new self-confidence and self-respect, which is enabling their inborn talents and capabilities to unfold naturally.

SKCV "CHILD" SYSTEM Projects are a model and unique example of meaningful assistance to voluntarily participating street children that can be replicated in any country of the world.



NEWS IN BRIEF

His Excellency visits SKCV

His Excellency Susheel Kumar Shinde, Governor of Andhra Pradesh visited SKCV Premavihar Children's Village on March 24th 2005. His Excellency has shared his childhood experiences and advised the children to choose the righteous path to become better citizens. The children showered His Excellency with many questions for which His Excellency answered very patiently and invited all the children at SKCV for a day at Raj Bhavan. SKCV has now been blessed four times by visits from Governors of Andhra Pradesh.

MP Visits Balaprema

Sri Ladagapati Rajgopal, Member of Parliament from Vijayawada visited Balaprema Street Girls Rescue Shelter on 1st September 2004. Girls were very happy to meet their MP. Mr. Rajgopal had spoken to girls and advised that they should have aims and goals in their lives and hard work is needed to achieve their goals. Mr. Rajagopal also visited our Boys Village and school and the Night Shelter.



Railway Children – UK continued support

Railway Children – UK has been supporting the Day Care/Night Shelter and Hospital in the city centre. Railway Children also facilitated capacity building workshops on management and HIV/AIDS. Monitoring and valuable advice are constantly offered by Ms. Mrinalini, Programme Manager of RC-UK. The Day Care/Night Shelter has facilitated vocational training for the children attending the programme in various skills such as commercial art, lamination, screen-printing, tailoring and computer operations. In 2004-2005, the Hospital supported by RC, has treated 2535 out-patient children and 333 in-patient children.



Day Care/Night Shelter

Field work has been regularised with on-site medical outreach. Computerisation of all records has been streamlined along with digital photos of children so missing children can be recognized by parents. Regular competitions for the children as well as sports and picnics to the beach and surrounding spots of interest. Contacting local school children, to donate one set of their old clothes each for the homeless children, which was successful. Already 13 schools on a regular basis donate old clothes through the "Children for Children" programme.

Street Children Vs 10th Class (O-levels/GCSE)

During the academic year 2004-2005, four children have successfully completed 10th class. J. Ramu had attained admission in Sarada College studying junior intermediate (MEC), A. Suresh is studying B.Com, Daniel is



undergoing training in digital imaging. This magnificent effort again for a further year, provides profuse encouragement for the children aspiring to finish Secondary School education. For 2005-2006 15 more children are working hard for the examinations.



Upcoming Project Girls Village

SELFRIDGES – An exclusive UK Store has come forward and offered grand assistance in initiating the structure for Girls Village. The Girls Village will have the same facilities and services as in Boys Village (Premavihar). The land & resources for the project have been secured. The plans are ready and the construction will commence in 2006.

Krishna Pushkarams at SKCV Bathing Ghat

SKCV Premavihar Children's Village served as a peaceful bathing ghat for more than 6000 pilgrims from Andhra Pradesh and from all over the country during recent Krishna Pushkarams from 28th August 2004 to 8th September 2004. These included Sri G.Vinod, Honourable Minister of Labour for State of Andhra Pradesh and famous Telugu Cine Artist Sri AVS along with many other distinguished citizens and philanthropists from Vijayawada. The bathing ghat was organised and maintained by SKCV through the guidance of the local authorities through erected proper barricades for safety of the pilgrims.

RBM Training

A unique and participatory training in Result Based Management was provided for SKCV staff was given by Association for Stimulating Know-how, Gurgaon at Kothavalasa, Visakhapatnam from 10th September to 18th September 2004. The eight days training was facilitated by Railway Children-UK, and was hosted by New Hope Rural leprosy Trust, Kothavalasa. SKCV thanks Railway Children for the training and New Hope for their warm hospitality.

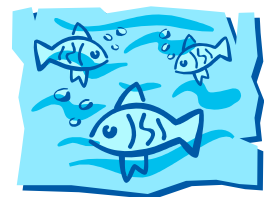


Capacity Building on HIV/AIDS

Prevention of HIV/AIDS is need of the hour and homeless street children are exposed to various abuses and are more vulnerable in catching this incurable infection. As SKCV works only with street children, the field staff was provided with the knowledge of HIV/AIDS, its spreading patterns and methods to prevent the incurable infection. The comprehensive orientation on HIV/AIDS and capacity building training was a great success. The entire training sequence was focused on preparing various modules to teach children about HIV/AIDS and to inculcate skills to prevent the same. This valuable training was given by Project Concern International, Salem to staff of SKCV. Sincere thanks to Mr. Antony Joseph and Mrs. Rochana Mitra from PCI and Mrs. Sornamma, Resource Person for their endeavour and staff from New Hope for sharing their best practices and their participation.

Krishna Meenostav – 2004 at SKCV

Krishna Meenostav 2004 was inaugurated by Mr. Mangal Rai Secretary DARE, New Delhi at SKCV Premavihar Children's Village on 11th October 2004. The programme aims at breeding fish in cages in the river Krishna. This was done by fixing 8 cages and one stand for the purpose. The senior trustee of SKCV Children's Trust and Former Mayor of Vijayawada Dr. Jandhyala Shankar and Trust Secretary Mrs. N. Bhakti Nidhi greeted the guests and explained the activities of SKCV in Vijayawada for street children. The whole programme was conducted by the Department of Fisheries, many delegates from Hyderabad as well as Joint Collector of Krishna District Sri Sampath Kumar IAS also attended the inaugural programme. All the delegates and the participants were



served breakfast prepared at Village. The officials insisted that even the children at the SKCV village should have the same breakfast. The elite persons from the department were satisfied with the services of SKCV Children's Trust and wished the children and staff the very best.



57th Independence Day Celebrations

On the occasion of the Independence Day all the children's participated in various games and many children received prizes for their efforts. At Santosh Bhavan Rtn. PDG K.V. Gopala Rao our Trustee presided over the function and distributed prizes to the children along with Sri Rangarajan, Manager SBI Station road Branch and Dr. Muralidhara Rao, Sirivella Nursing Home. Girls from Balaprema celebrated the day with the City Police at Police Parade Grounds and performed dance items.

Samadarshana Yatra

With the invitation from Sri Lagadapati Rajagopal MP from Vijayawada all the children from SKCV participated in Gandhiji Samadarshana Yatra on 2nd October and 14th November 2004. Children actively participated in the rallies along with other 29 schools from all over the city. Through these kinds of events children interact with other children and develop their capacity in knowing that they are part of society.

Seminars / Workshops

A National Seminar on "The Role of Social Work Organisations and Institutions and their adaptability to the present scenario" was conducted by Maris Stella College on 5th and 6th November 2004 at their premises. M. Krishna Prasad from SKCV had presented a full length paper on "Understanding Street Children". The paper was appreciated by all the delegates of the seminar. Krishna Prasad was presented with a certificate for the paper presentation.



Valuable local Government support

The Municipal Corporation at Vijayawada has always extended strong support projects for street children in the city. This unprecedented support is proving to be a prime example to other Municipal Corporations in the country, both as the concerned IAS officers are transferred to different locations and duties, and also as other commissioners and mayoral bodies hear of the Vijayawada Precedents, and act on them in their locations.
